## Computer Camps

Jason Quattrone, FSMH's Instructional Technologist, is excited to offer two new computer camps this summer:

## Scratch Computer Programming

July 5-8 (Ages 9-14)

Interested in coding but not sure where to start? Scratch is a fun and easy way to learn the basics of programming by using drag-and-drop blocks. This camp will focus on the basic functionality of Scratch, as campers will develop a solid foundation for creating animation and basic games.

### Minecraft Madness

July 18-22 (Ages 9-14)

Love Minecraft? This camp will explore a Minecraft programming tool called a redstone circuit, which is a structure that can be built to activate or control mechanisms. The principles of using redstone are very similar to that of building real-life electronics circuits. In this course, campers will learn how to incorporate redstone into your Minecraft world to make it more interactive. As an added bonus, they'll also be previewing computer programming for Minecraft.
